Course Description and Objectives	This is a Basic Spanish course that focuses on the four skills: speaking, reading, writing, and listening through the study of Spanish and Latin culture. By the end of the course, the learners will be able to use their newly acquired skills to communicate in Spanish.  They will be able to describe people and objects and compare ideas. The learners will begin to develop their ability to communicate effectively and express themselves with confidence in Spanish. SBC: Partially fulfills: LANG				
Purpose	This Spanish course is designed to introduce the student to all aspects of foreign language study. The course includes speaking, listening, reading, and writing exercises.  The learners will practice the language through individual and group activities based on various material and exercises. Multimedia materials such as short videos, music and documentaries will be presented to cover different aspects of Spanish and Latin American culture, broadening learners learning experience. There are weekly homework assignments, oral tests, midterm and final exams.				
Attendance Policy	1. If a student accumulates 7 absences (equivalent to 20% of the class) without proper documentation from a doctor, they will automatically fail the course with a final grade of F.  2. Students promptly inform the instructor of any absences, either in advance or immediately after.  3. The instructor has the discretion to classify absences as "excused."  4. To have an absence excused, students must provide acceptable documentation explaining the reason for their absence.  5.If a student submits a medical document, it should clearly state that the attending doctor recommends non-attendance due to illness or disease.  6.Submitting a medical document does not automatically guarantee that the absence will be excused.

Attendance (15%)  1. If a student arrives late to class three times or leaves class without permission before it concludes, they will incur a 1% deduction each time. Additionally, being absent will result in a 2% deduction each time.  2- Three tardies or leaving class without completing it will be considered equivalent to one absence.				

- 3- A student who accumulates 7 unexcused absences without providing a doctor's note explicitly stating their inability to attend the class due to health reasons, will automatically receive a failing grade (F).
- ■Assignments (15%)
- 1- Every month, students must submit an assignment via email following the format provided by the teacher.
- 2- The email subject should be in the format: "Task1 Name Student-number," with the attached file.
- 3- Each homework will have its deadline. Late submission of each assignment will incur a 1% deduction, and assignments not delivered will result in a 2% deduction.
- 4-Late submission of assignments will not be accepted after the midterm and final exams.
- Presentations (10%)
- 1- Each student will have a presentation in the semester about what we have learned and will choose a country of the 21 countries that speak Spanish as an official language for the presentation.
- Mid-term (15%) and Final Exams (15%)
- 1- Both exams will assess the content that has been studied or explained in class.
- 2- Any act of cheating during the exams will result in a grade of 0.
- 3- Students must follow the instructions provided during the exams.
- ■Oral Test (30%)
- 1- The oral test will also be based on class content.
- 2- Students should adhere to the instructions given during the test.
- 3- The oral test will take place in week 16 of the semester, with assigned time slots. The teacher will record the test to assess pronunciation and language proficiency.

The final course grade is determined by considering a combination of factors, including homework, exams, attendance, and participation. The grade can be translated into a grade point value according to the established scale:
